Arthur L. Kay, 91, of Newark, Del., went home to be with his Lord and Savior, on Thursday, March 28. He was surrounded by his children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren.

Art was born in Upland, PA, to John and Elizabeth Kay. Art was devoted in life, to his wife of 66 years, Barbara, who predeceased him. He is survived by his daughter Linda Eklund, son George (Deb) Kay, son David (Nancy) Kay, daughter Barbie (Mike) Lefrancois, son Stephen (Linda) Kay; 11 grandchildren and 18 great-grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his parents and brothers, John and George.

Art graduated from Collingswood High School in New Jersey. He served in the Navy prior to earning a Bachelor's Degree in History from Rutgers University. He attended Faith Theological Seminary in Philadelphia before being ordained as a Minister of the Gospel in the Bible Presbyterian Church. Art served as pastor of the Evangelical Presbyterian Church of Star Cross, in Williamstown, New Jersey, and later as pastor of the Ventnor City Presbyterian Church in New Jersey, from 1961 to 1964. He then served as national youth director and director of Christian Training, Inc. for the Reformed Presbyterian Church. During this time, he was also instrumental in establishing Coventry House, in Coventry, Connecticut, and served as director from 1967 to 1982. Through this rustic retreat center, he and Barbara impacted many lives. After retiring

from ministry, Art partnered with family members in several small business ventures.
