Byron H. Moore was born on October 7, 1954, in Wilmington, DE, (at St. Francis Hospital - as he liked to add), the son of the late Luther A. Moore and Anne Mae (Singleton) Moore.

In the mid-1970's, Byron was born again, became a child of God, and was delivered out of the kingdom of darkness, and translated into the Kingdom of God's beloved Son. Above everything, Byron is a worshipper of God and a lover of the God's Word.

In 1983, Byron married his special friend, June (McNamara) Moore. Together, they moved to Oklahoma, and two of his greatest honors were to graduate from Rhema Bible Training Center in 1986, (together with his wife), and to serve as one of the worship leaders at Grace Fellowship under Daniel Amstutz.

Byron played guitar and piano, wrote many of his own worship songs, played and sang at weddings, and was part of the praise and worship team at various churches he attended over the years. He had a habit of singing out spontaneous love songs to the Lord. He also led a small music group of fellow church friends called "Prosperity."

For quite a few years, Byron greatly enjoyed being a faithful member in various prayer groups as part of the Prayer Ministry at Rhema's Prayer and Healing Center, along with his wife.

Byron had an awesome speaking and singing voice, was used of the Holy Spirit in the prophetic flow, had a great sense of humor, loved to laugh (hard), was a man of prayer, loved his wife, enjoyed eating almost anything, but especially Mexican.

Byron graduated from the University of Delaware with a B.A. in Political Science. He worked in various positions as a counselor to troubled teens and in Child Protective Services for the State of Delaware, before retiring early on disability.

While still in his twenties, Byron began experiencing numerous symptoms in his body that culminated in a diagnosis of Multiple Sclerosis. For close to 40 years Byron fought a courageous fight to live and love and serve God despite so many challenges. He can only be called a "Trooper." He never lost his joy, love for God, and desire to worship.

On Sunday, December 14, 2025, Byron left us for his Heavenly home, to meet Jesus face to face, to worship HIM, and await our coming!

Until then, Byron is survived by his beloved wife of 42½ years, June Moore; his sister Sharon Moore and her husband Julius Jackson; his brother, Rourke Moore; several sister- and brother-in-laws, nephews, nieces, and cousins.
