Drew Alan Horseman, 61, of Bear, Delaware, went home to be with Lord on October 3, 2024, on the banks of the Ocmulgee River in Jackson, Georgia while doing what he loved, Geocaching. He was born October 13, 1962, in Wilmington, DE, to the late Dayton Nelson Horseman and Iris Ruth (Williams) Horseman. Drew graduated from Elkton Christian Academy and then Liberty University in 1986 with a Bachelor of Science in Accounting.

Drew made his career as a C.P.A. and worked in the field for 36 years, serving most recently as the Director of Finance for The Wilmington Parking Authority. He was a member of Armstrong Lodge #26 AF&AM in Newport, Delaware where he had served as Treasurer for a number of years.

Drew was a loving father and doting grandfather. His granddaughter Kaylee was the apple of his eye and brought him immense joy.

Drew was a diverse hobbyist, traveler, sportsman, and outdoorsman. He loved the outdoors and enjoyed spending his free time hiking, fishing, and exploring new places. In his passion for Geocaching and adventure he amassed over 30,000 geocache "finds" across the 48 continental United States.

Drew is survived by two sons, William Horseman and Timothy Horseman, of Bear; and one granddaughter, Kaylee Horseman, also of Bear; as well as, a

large circle of close friends.

A memorial service will be held on Saturday, November 2, 2024 at Bible Fellowship Church of Newark, 808 S Old Baltimore Pike, Newark, DE 19702, where friends may call from 10-11 AM with a memorial service following at 11 AM. He will be laid to rest with his parents in Muncy, Pennsylvania at a later date.

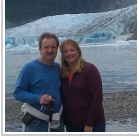
