



## Gregory Levi Dennis

January 29, 1959 - April 5, 2019

Gregory was born in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, on January 29, 1959. He died on Friday, April 5 2019 after a courageous fight against cancer. Gregory grew up in South Philadelphia and graduated from Southwark (part of South Philadelphia High School), in 1977. Growing up in Philly he was odd man out with his love for the Dallas Cowboys football team. He was often heard saying, "How 'bout them Cowboys?" From an early age Gregory always had a passion for trains. He started working for Conrail which later became part of SEPTA, where he was employed for 38 years, until he retired February 1, 2019. Gregory liked big cars and enjoyed traveling which he and Barbara did extensively. He enjoyed working on a variety of projects around the home and for family and friends including working on cars. Gregory enjoyed jazz and had started taking music lessons to play the saxophone. He practiced and was able to play well the song "Listen, Obey and Be Blessed". Gregory had a great sense of humor, which he kept right up to the end. He had a unique laugh. He was often heard to say: "I ain't got time for that foolishness", or referring to someone as "that joker"

Gregory married Barbara Jean Spain on June 19, 1993. Gregory and Barbara blended their families, to include 6 children. He dedicated his life to Jehovah, March 23, 1996. He served as a Ministerial Servant and later became an Elder, November 3, 2008. He was always enriched by the time he spent in service and with his friends.

Gregory loved his family and is survived by his wife, Barbara; mother, DeCoris Dennis; daughter, Marquita and husband, Tommy Bulla; grandchildren: Darius, and Kayla; sisters: Renell, Dina, and Renita; extended family, Bernard Spain and children Bernard Jr. and Isaiah; Romunda and children Alicia and Mariah;, Jamilah and children Naji and Angelina; and brother Aaron.
