Holly Diane Reutter was born on December 10, 1979. She was a 1998 graduate of St. Mark's High School, a member of her school's field hockey team, choir, and drama department. She had a dazzling smile, a crazy sense of humor, and gave really good hugs. She loved singing, driving with the car windows down, playing with makeup, and a cold can of soda (Coke, if you've got it). Holly succumbed on Friday, May 1 after a 20-year battle with addiction and mental illness. She loved fiercely and made her own decisions, and we celebrated her victories over anxiety and depression, however temporary the reprieve. We will lovingly carry her memory in our hearts forever.

Holly is survived by her parents, D. Wesley Reutter and Terri M. Reutter; her sister and brother-in-law, Kristin R. and Joseph G. Spix III; and her beloved nephews, Joseph and Nathan Spix; as well as extended family members.
