Louella G. (Shepherd) Reimer, age 86, of Bear, DE, went home to be with the Lord on August 3, 2015, two weeks after her husband, Anthony “Tony” J. Reimer, passed away on July 20, 2015. She passed away peacefully at her home. Tony and Louella were married for over 67 years.

Louella was the daughter of the late Ernest G. Shepherd and Carrie Ruth (Helmick) Hughes. She retired after teaching kindergarten for over 20 years at a number of Christian schools in New Castle County. Her last position was as an administrator at Pike Creek Christian School, Newark, DE. They donated the crafts to their church or gave them away to friends and family. She remained active till her health declined in late 2014.
