Mark C. Han, 79, of Newark, DE, went home to be with the Lord on Friday, October 4, 2013 after a courageous battle with cancer.

Born July 2, 1934, in the city of Suzhou, Jiangsu Province, China, Mark came to the United States in 1953 and graduated from Erskine College in South Carolina and completed his graduate work at the University of Pennsylvania. His career as an analytical and research chemist spanned 20 years at the University of Pennsylvania Museum of Archaeology and Anthropology, and another 20 years with DuPont. After retiring he continued to teach at Delaware Technical Community College, and pursued his hobbies of boating, fishing, and spending time with his grandchildren. He was active with the Wilmington Community Evangelical Church. Mark's love of God was his life.

Mark is survived of his wife of 50 years, Gloria, sons Daniel and wife Laurie, David and wife Betsy, sister Mary Richard of Wales, England, and grandchildren Andrew, Rachel, Abigail, and Emily.
