Warren Christopher Thompson Jr., a beloved husband, father, and veteran, passed away peacefully on August 26, 2024, at Christiana Hospital, surrounded by his family and loved ones. He was 81 years old.

Born on August 19, 1943, in Baltimore, Maryland, Warren lived a life marked by dedication and service. He faithfully served in full tour of duty in the Vietnam War. Upon coming home, he earned his bachelor's degree in chemistry from Delaware Tech Community College and Wilmington College. Soon after, he was hired into the DuPont company, he grew and transitioned in several roles over his 40 years plus career, during which he was located at both Stine-Haskell Research Center and the DuPont Experimental Station.

Warren's commitment extended beyond his professional life, as an officer in the United States Army and a Vietnam veteran. He exemplified courage and resilience. His charitable spirit was evident in his support of family, friends and various organizations, particularly the Red Cross, reflecting his deep sense of community and service.

In his personal life, Warren found joy in many pursuits. Summers were spent at the Delaware Beaches, where he enjoyed body surfing and sunbathing with family. During winter you could find him on the ski slopes of the Poconos and Colorado Rockies. His passion for travel enriched his life and the lives of

those around him.

Warren is survived by his devoted wife, Elizabeth O'Connor; his children, Tabitha Jane Thompson, Warren Christopher Thompson III; Christine McCann, Alison McCann, Sean McCann (Logan), his beloved eight grandchildren, and two great-grandchildren. In addition, he is also survived by his sister, Susan Shotzberger (Greg), and predeceased by his sister, Jane Lindenberg (Gerald).

A visitation will be held Monday, September 9, 2024, from 9:30-10:30 AM at Holy Angels Parish, 82 Possum Park Road, Newark, DE 19711 followed by a memorial service to honor Warren's life at 10:30 AM.
